This bill gifts over \$60 billion to Ukraine with no cost offsets and minimal mechanisms for oversight.


The House Republican majority has been clear in our goals: to stand with Israel and secure our border, but this package does more for Ukraine's border security than our own. Over \$300 million is directed to their border security and counter narcotics efforts while the U.S. border and the American people get nothing.

These bills are being "paid for" with money we don't have, for policies that we don't want. To say that I am flummoxed as to why Speaker Mike Johnson took us down this road is an understatement. The fact that he had to cobble together Democrat votes to pass a rule, and then cobble even more together to pass the package of bills speaks volumes. He was rewarded with the Democrats breaking all rules of decorum by gleefully handing out and waving Ukrainian flags on the House floor. I doubt that any of them would do the same with American flags.

Justice Denied

This week, I joined my fellow impeachment managers and walked the Articles of Impeachment against Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas to the Senate. Unfortunately, Senate Democrats set a new precedent – and a new low – and immediately dismissed the articles without a hearing or a trial, something which has never been done in the history of this nation. Secretary Mayorkas has not just ignored, but blatantly violated our laws, and then lied to Congress and the American people. He should have had his day in court, and the American people deserved to hear the case against him.

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H.R. 7375

For more positive news, my bill, H.R. 7375, was passed by the House Natural Resources Committee and now awaits a vote by the full House of Representatives! This bill would incentivize the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) to finally do its job and offer parcels of land for lease sales to oil and gas producers. Until the BLM actually puts land up for bids, they should not collect Expression of Interest (EOI) fees on those lands. You can watch my comments on the bill [via this link](#).

Introducing The POSTAL Act

I was proud to introduce my most recent bill, H.R. 8045, the *Postal Operations Stay Timely and Local (POSTAL) Act!* I continue to hear concerns from across Wyoming about the U.S. Postal Service's intent to downgrade the processing and distribution centers (P&DC) in Cheyenne and Casper, transporting Wyoming's mail processing out of state. This change will delay the delivery of bills, paychecks, packages, and medications and send Wyoming's election ballots to Denver, Salt Lake City, and Billings, reducing our ability to ensure ballot integrity and potentially delaying the delivery of thousands of ballots until after an election concludes.

My bill will prevent the USPS from closing the P&DCs in Wyoming and across the nation if doing so would negatively impact mail delivery or close the only P&DC within a state. I'm proud to have Senators Lummis and Barrasso support my bill and look forward to arguing in favor of my bill soon.

- Voted **YES** on [H.R. 6408](#), [H.R. 5917](#), [H.R. 4681](#), [H.R. 6046](#), and [H.R. 5826](#), which target terrorist groups and terrorist supporting organizations with sanctions and other punitive actions.
- Vote **YES** on [H.R. 6323](#), [H.R. 4691](#), [H.R. 3033](#), [H.R. 5947](#), [H.R. 6603](#), [H.R. 6015](#), [H.R. 6245](#), [H.R. 5921](#), and [H.R. 5923](#), which reinstitute, strengthen, and extend sanctions and other punishments against Iranian leaders and institutions due to their supporting of terrorism and attacks against Israel and increase oversight on the President's implementation of sanctions against Iran.
- Voted **YES** on [H.Res. 1143](#), [H.Res. 883](#), and [H.Res. 288](#), which condemn Iran's attack on Israel, condemn the anti-semitic slogan "from the river to the sea, Palestine will be free", and call on the EU to designate Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps as a terrorist organization.
- Voted **YES** on [H.R. 4639](#), the *Fourth Amendment is Not For Sale Act*.

Cosponsored Legislation

Here are some highlights of [bills I'm cosponsoring](#):

- [H.R. 7830](#), the *Protect American Widows (PAW) Act*, which extends the surviving spouse filing status for widows and widowers from 2 years to 5 years.
- [H.R. 7079](#), the *Banning EPA's Encroachment on Facilities (BEEF) Act*, which blocks a proposed EPA rule that could potentially force over 3,800 small meat and poultry processors out of business.


