Washington, D.C. continues to be an exciting place to be right now, with new announcements coming from the White House on a daily basis. We are watching in real time as several of our priorities are coming to fruition, and our country is better for it.

I was thrilled to be present when President Trump signed his executive order banning males from competing in female sports. I am also pleased that Department of the Interior Secretary Burgum was taking steps to reverse the previous administration's war on the West, from its refusal to delist grizzly bears to its direct attack on affordable and reliable energy. I look forward to continuing to work with the Trump administration to push for policies that improve the lives of Wyomingites and all Americans.

President Trump Signs Order Protecting Female Sports

I was honored to attend President Trump's signing of an executive order to protect female sports by using the power of the purse to make it clear that we are not going to send federal dollars to schools that allow men and boys to compete against women and girls and invade their private spaces. This executive order will ensure fair competition and will safeguard opportunities for female athletes. The order is in line with the goals of [H.R.28](#), the Protection of Women and Girls in Sports Act, legislation I proudly cosponsored and debated on the floor and that passed the House of Representatives last month. It is my hope that the Senate quickly considers and passes this vital bill so that these protections become the law of the land and prevent future Democrat administrations from adopting policies that place women and girls at risk.

What a breath of fresh air this is as compared to the Biden-Harris administration, which worked tirelessly to promote a radical gender ideology aimed at empowering transgender individuals and erasing women's rights. These efforts permeated the last administration, including an attempt to rewrite the very purpose and meaning of Title IX to redefine "sex" to include "gender identity." These proposed changes led to countless lawsuits before a federal judge rightfully struck them down. I remain committed as your Representative to ensuring fairness in female athletics and providing for the safety of women and girls as Title IX, the Fourteenth Amendment, and countless civil rights statutes were intended.

Calling on the Trump Admin to Delist Grizzly Bears

I led several of my western colleagues this past Wednesday in sending a [letter](#) to President Trump and DOI Secretary Doug Burgum urging them to reverse a last-minute Biden-Harris administration decision to reclassify western grizzly populations into a single Distinct Population Segment (DPS).

Creating a single DPS that spans all six grizzly bear recovery areas—covering nearly all of Washington, Idaho, Montana, and Wyoming—undermines species revitalization efforts and endangers communities affected by exploding grizzly populations. We instead call on the administration to delist the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem (GYE) grizzly bear, returning management to the states' capable hands.

Working to Prioritize Issues Important to Wyoming

On Monday, Secretary Burgum issued his first round of secretarial orders. Order No. [3418](#) implements President Trump's Executive Order [14154](#), "Unleashing American Energy." The order directs all Assistant Secretaries to include in their action plans steps to review and revise all relevant draft and all finalized resource management plans, including the Rock Springs, Wyoming, Resource Management Plan and Final Environmental Impact Statement; the Sage Grouse Proposed Resource Management Plan Amendment and Final Environmental Impact Statement; and the Buffalo, Wyoming, Record of Decision and Approved Resource Management Plan Amendment.

These actions are incredibly important to Wyoming and the country as a whole. Energy security is national security. Our prosperity is based on having access to affordable and reliable energy. The fact that Secretary Burgum moved so quickly on these issues speaks volumes regarding how important Wyoming's legacy industries are to President Trump's agenda. As your Representative, I am committed to pursuing sound energy policy. I am pleased to see Secretary Burgum is also so committed, and I look forward to working with him and the Trump administration to quickly undo the damage caused by the predecessors.

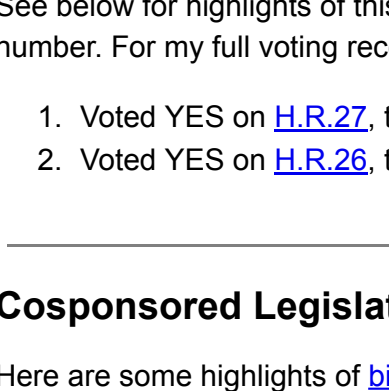

AARP Shares Resources for Tax Season

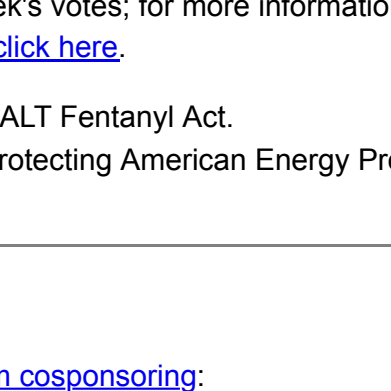

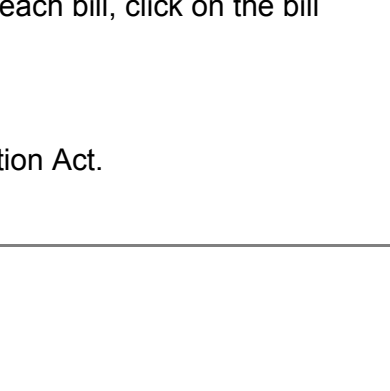

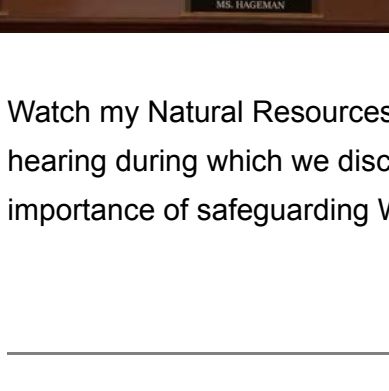
I had a great time visiting with Cheyenne Frontier FFA. Wyoming FFA members are the cream of the crop, and I loved hearing about these students' future plans.



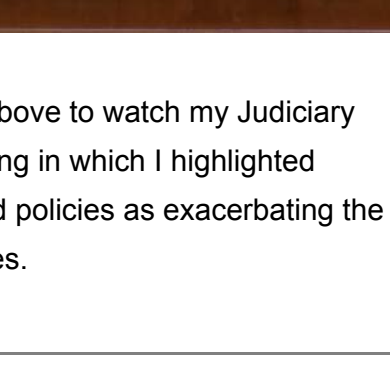
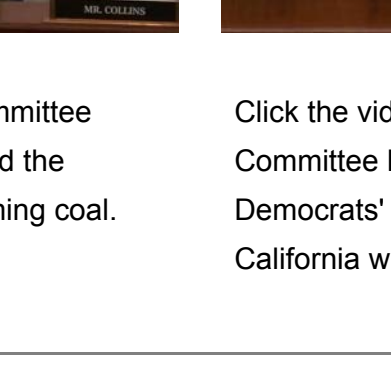
I enjoyed meeting with the Wyoming Association of Rural Water Systems and am thankful for all this organization does to protect our most precious resource while serving our communities.

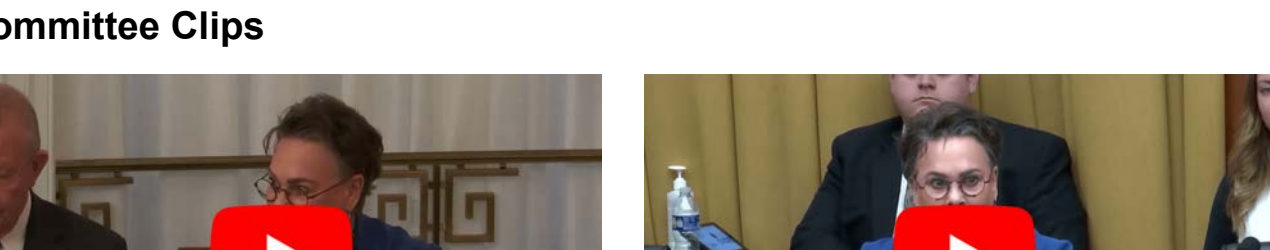

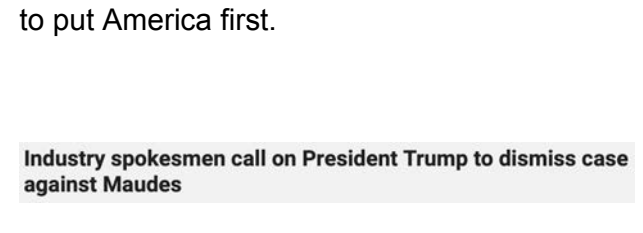

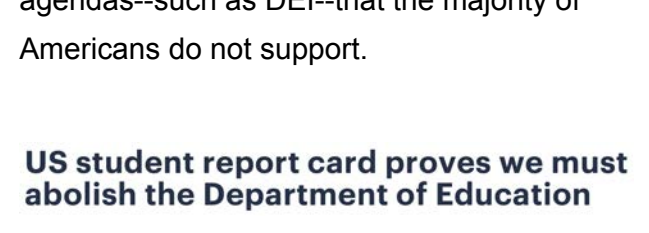
