WYOMING'S CONGRESSWOMAN

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Hello Laura,

I was happy to be back in Wyoming last week, where I hosted town halls in Campbell and Crook Counties. We were also honored to welcome Representative Pete Stauber, Chairman of the Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources, and Natural Resources Committee staff to the Powder River Basin (PRB), to showcase some of Wyoming's uranium operations and coal mines, as well as a generation unit at the Neil Simpson Complex.

I want to thank everyone who attended my two town halls! I was honored to answer your questions and provide you with an update on the work I am doing as your lone representative in the House of Representatives. Keep reading below to learn more about how I am fighting to combat radical climate activists and Biden's disastrous border policies.

Working to Ensure American Energy Independence

On Tuesday, I introduced [H.R.8781](#) to block the implementation of the Proposed Resource Management Plan (RMP) Amendment and Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement for Federal coal managed by the Buffalo Field Office of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM). This [rule](#) pursues the no new leasing alternative, seeking to end coal production in Wyoming by 2041, closing 12 of Wyoming's active coal mines and putting 48 billion short tons of BLM-administered federal coal off limits for mining. The Washington Post published an [article](#) touting this rule as the U.S.'s "biggest step yet to end coal mining."

It is cruel and inhumane to pursue policies that are designed to increase the cost of energy, food, and housing, yet that is exactly what this latest attack on our coal industry is designed to do. The Biden administration's effort to impose energy poverty by government fiat must be blocked.

Wyoming powers America, and the PRB produces more than 40% of our nation's coal. In the wake of the Biden administration's feckless energy policies, it is now more important than ever that we oppose these efforts to end U.S. coal production and remain committed to protecting our natural energy sources, energy independence, and energy security. I want to extend my profound appreciation to our coal producers and workers; your hard work does not go unnoticed, and I will continue to fight for U.S. energy production.

Fighting to Combat Biden's Border Crisis

As early as this upcoming week, the House will consider the State and Foreign Operations appropriations bill, the text of which currently includes up to \$2.4 billion to the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees and the International Organization for Migration. These two entities funnel U.S. taxpayer dollars to non-governmental organizations (NGOs), who in turn provide "cash debit cards, food, clothing, medical treatment, shelter, and even 'humanitarian transportation'" to illegal aliens, according to the Center for Immigration Studies. In other words, these entities are facilitating mass migration at our southern border and doing so *using our own money*.

I submitted two amendments to the appropriations bill that will block funds being distributed to both of these corrupt, globalist organizations. As your representative, I will continue to do all I can to put America first and end taxpayer funding of the Biden administration's open border crisis.

My Priorities for Fiscal Year 2025 Appropriations Cycle: Pt. 3

US 191 Pavement Rehabilitation, Rock Springs to Utah Border – WYDOT

This rehabilitation project will improve pavement condition, safety, ride quality, and overall level of service along 6 miles of US 191 from an area south of Rock Springs, WY, to the Utah border. The road is a national Scenic Byway route that handles significant tourism traffic as well as freight and other through traffic affecting Rock Springs and southwest Wyoming.

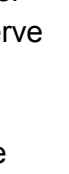
Rock Springs General Aviation Apron Rehabilitation and Expansion Project – Southwest Wyoming Regional Airport (RKS)

This project will rehabilitate and extend the General Aviation (GA) apron to expand the airport's capacity and increase safety. This will reduce the likelihood of accidents while improving operational efficiency by enhancing apron flow and minimizing interference during taxiing, ultimately ensuring safer operations for both aircraft and ground handling crews. This project also plays a significant role in positively influencing economic development, tourism, and connectivity within Wyoming by allowing the airport to accommodate increased traffic.

Snow King Complete Street Project – Town of Jackson, WY

This project will improve sewer infrastructure along Snow King Avenue to boost safety for all roadway users, enhance accessibility to downtown Jackson, and promote watershed health by improving sanitary sewer infrastructure to mitigate negative impacts to the Flat Creek Watershed. This project will allow for the completion of adequate sewer collection infrastructure to convey sewage to the Town's permitted Wastewater Treatment Plant, protecting Flat Creek and the Snake River from water quality impairments related to human waste.

[Apply to Attend a Service Academy!](#)

The window to apply for a congressional Service Academy nomination is now open until October 31! The honor of attending a service academy comes with the obligation and commitment to serve in the military for a minimum of five years upon graduation.

Members of Congress may nominate candidates for appointment to four of the five U.S. service academies: U.S. Military Academy (USMA), West Point, NY; the U.S. Naval Academy (USNA), Annapolis, MD; the U.S. Air Force Academy (USAF), Colorado Springs, CO; and the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy (USMMA), Kings Point, NY. The fifth service academy, the U.S. Coast Guard Academy (USCGA), New London, CT, does not require a congressional nomination for appointment.

My office may nominate up to ten individuals for each vacant academy slot allotted to our district. 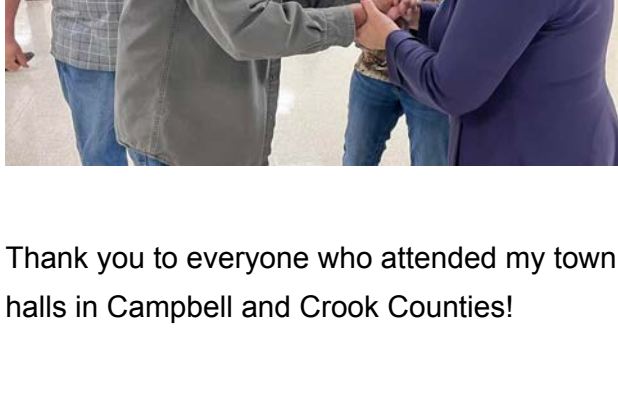

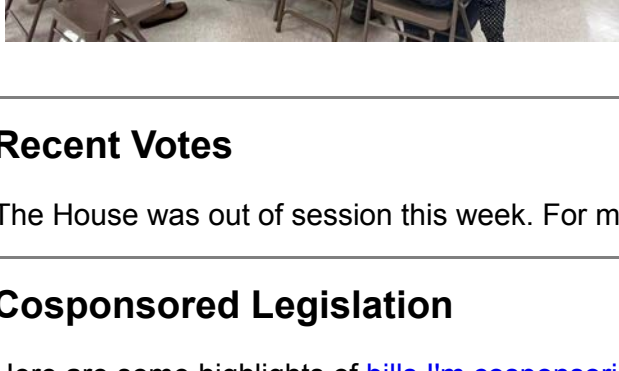

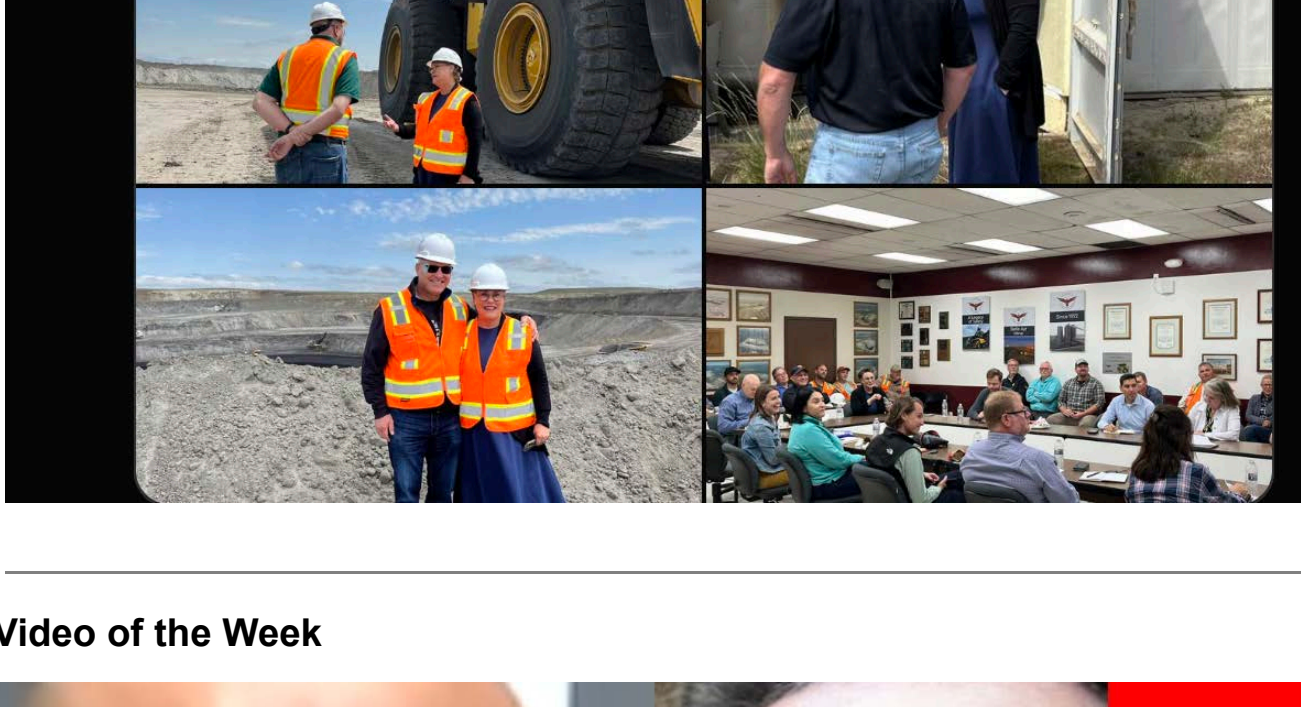

Cosponsored Legislation

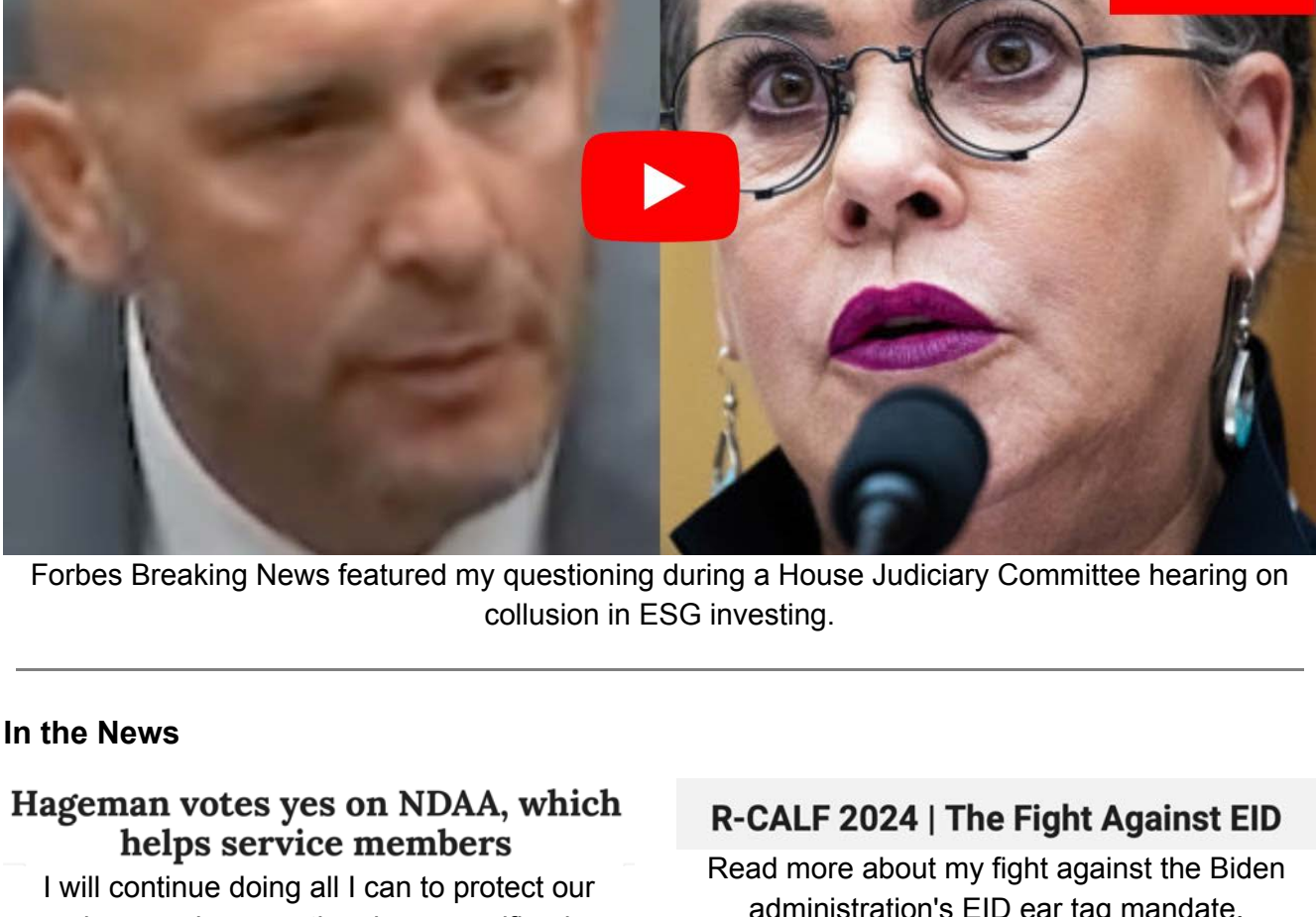
Here are some highlights of [bills I'm cosponsoring](#):


