

In just 7 legislative days, we stood strong for parent's rights through the passage of **H.R. 5**, passed the bipartisan **Lower Energy Costs Act**, debated dozens of Republican and Democrat amendments for each bill, and held multiple hearings to make government bureaucrats accountable and ensure ample resources for generations to come.

To top it off, I was asked to join Speaker McCarthy as he signed **H.J. Res 27**, which nullifies the recent illegal power grab with the so-called "Waters of the United States" (WOTUS) rule proposed by EPA. Rest assured, there will be many more photos like this in the months to come!



The First Amendment vs Government Censorship



The Select Subcommittee on the Weaponization of the Federal Government met this past week to discuss the information that has been exposed in *Missouri v. Biden*, an ongoing lawsuit challenging the Biden administration's violation of the First Amendment by directing social media companies to censor and suppress American's free speech.

On Thursday I questioned Mr. Sauer on the breadth and scope of the vast censorship industrial complex that has been uncovered through the hard work of the Missouri and Louisiana Attorneys General. The overwhelming evidence confirms our worst fears — that government censorship is growing, expanding, and becoming more pervasive, which also shows that government surveillance is growing, expanding and becoming more pervasive. We know that viewpoint discrimination is happening in real-time at all levels of Joe Biden's administration, with over 84 federal officials actively engaged in on-going censorship on everything from Covid-19, to election integrity, to parents' involvement in our schools.

Censorship does not make us safer or protect us from the government — it does just the opposite. Mr. Sauer's oral and written testimony present stunning evidence on the scope of the federal government's ongoing effort to violate our First Amendment rights, with officials throughout the administration communicating with and directing Twitter and Facebook to censor Americans. At least eight FBI agents in just one field office engaged in extensive censorship activities. All this in addition to the 20 White House officials involved in communications to censor our speech.

H.R. 1- Lower Energy Costs Act and the COAL Act


This week, House Republicans passed H.R. 1, the Lowering Energy Costs Act. This landmark legislation will end the Biden administration's war on energy by streamlining leasing and permitting, incentivizing domestic mineral production, ending the de facto moratorium on coal, and modernizing federal regulations. It will restore America's place in energy production and take us from energy poverty to one of prosperity, reducing global emissions simultaneously by replacing dirty, unregulated foreign energy production with clean, cheap, reliable American energy.

Included in this monumental piece of legislation is my Combating Obstruction Against Leasing (COAL) Act which addresses the issues above by forcing the Secretary of the Department of the Interior to act on the many outstanding coal permits and leases.

This legislation, which passed the House of Representatives this week, now heads to the Senate; I call on my colleagues in Congress' upper chamber to listen to the people and join us in supporting American energy independence.

Congratulations, Jim Gatchell Memorial Museum!

Earlier this week, the [Jim Gatchell Memorial Museum](#) in Buffalo, Wyoming was named as a finalist for the 2023 National Medal for Museum and Library Service. This annual award, provided by the [Institute of Museum and Library Services](#), is the nation's highest honor recognizing these institutions' excellence in service to their communities.



The museum, which is housed in Buffalo's historic Carnegie Library, is dedicated to preserving the culture and history of Johnson County, Wyoming, and the Western frontier through a variety of dioramas and artifacts, as well as Native American history.

While the medal winners will be announced in late May, the IMLS will be featuring the Jim Gatchell Memorial Museum and other finalists on their social media channels throughout the next two months.




- Voted **YES** on **H.R. 1**, the Lower Energy Costs Act


