The Biden administration prefers to rely on coal from China, and oil and gas from Russia, Iran, and Venezuela – anywhere but here. It is pursuing an energy policy that seeks to destroy our access to and use of safe, clean, reliable energy here in America, including in Wyoming.

It is an energy policy designed to increase the cost of the very building blocks of a civilized society, such as food, housing, concrete, fertilizer, transportation, and manufacturing.

Last week, my colleagues and I passed H.R. 1, the Lower Energy Costs Act. This bill opens up investment in energy-producing ventures and reforms the piecemeal, broken permitting process in place under NEPA. H.R. 1 signifies an important step in restoring the United States to a land of plenty, while simultaneously furthering national security by lessening our dependence on foreign, often hostile, nations to keep our lights on and fridges filled.

My COAL Act, which is part of this bill, abolishes Biden's freeze on new coal leases and will restart the process of approving applications pending review. It's now up to the Senate to consider and pass this monumental legislation and return America to where we belong: being the global leader in energy development and deployment of innovative technologies.

H.R. 1 is projected to lower energy costs by

Cosponsored Legislation

Here are some highlights of [bills I'm cosponsoring](#):

- H.R. 2427**, which will award a Congressional Gold Medal to the Hmong people for their distinguished service in the Vietnam war and the fight against communism.
- H.R. 2436**, which expands penalties for illegal entry into the United States.
- H.R. 1524**, the FAIR Act of 2023, which prohibits the Biden administration, federal contractors, and all federal fund recipients from intentionally discriminating against or granting a preference to any person based on race, color, or national origin.
- H.R. 1275**, which prohibits the use of federal funds for Executive Order 14091.
- H.R. 1229**, the Stop CRT Act, which codified Executive Order 13950 and prohibits federal funds from going to any entity that teaches or advances CRT.
- H.R. 1200**, the National Right-to-Work Act", which permits employees right to choose whether or not to participate in unions or other labor organizations.

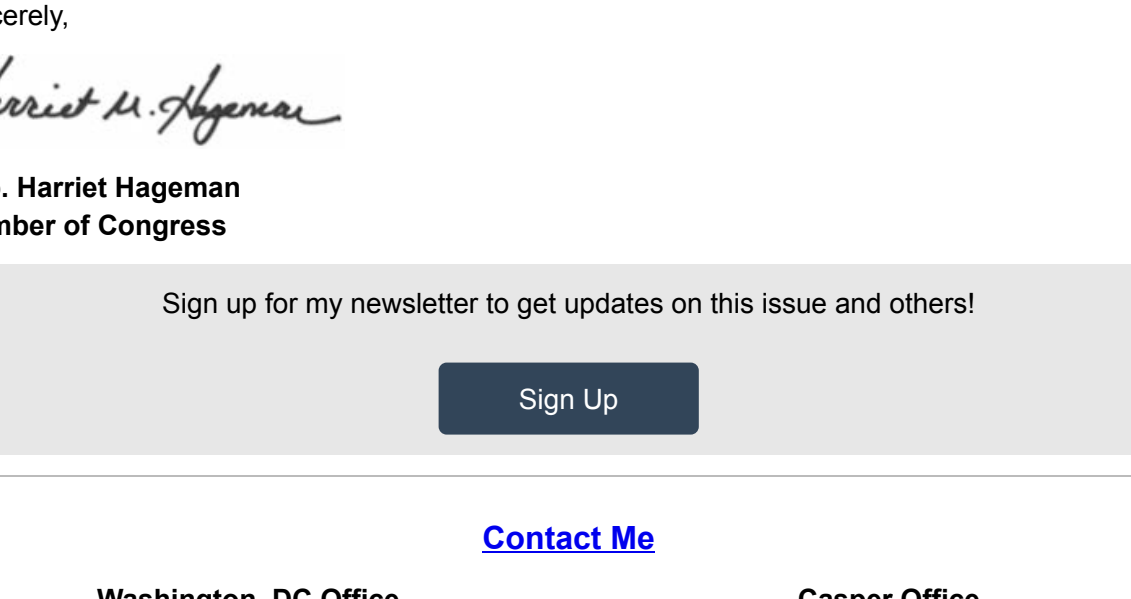

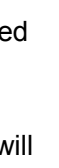
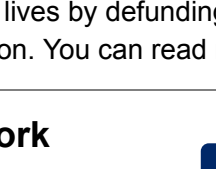
