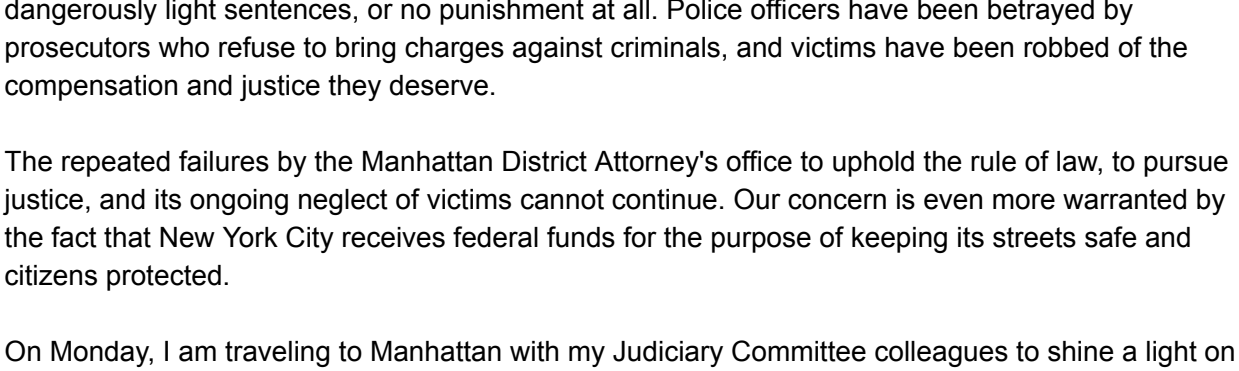

Biden's Flawed WOTUS Rule

President Biden and his failed bureaucratic administrative state continue to push through their radical water and land grab, as well as their unworkable climate agenda, by adopting oppressive and overreaching regulations that will **hobble** American businesses, **destroy** our prosperity, and **undermine** our national security. But freedom loving and constitutionally-grounded Americans in both the legislative and judicial branches continue to stand for the rule of law and against these detrimental policies.

Earlier this week, U.S. District Judge Hovland halted implementation of the EPA's most recent unlawful WOTUS rule in 24 states. Biden's WOTUS rule, similar to one pushed through during the Obama administration, would have redefined what is meant by the phrase "navigable waters of the United States," in order to expand federal jurisdiction and control over everything from irrigation ditches, to mud puddles, to roadside ditches, to intermittent and ephemeral streams, to groundwater, and everything else you can imagine — its very purpose being to effectively steal private property from Wyoming's ranchers, farmers, energy producers and others.

If this all sounds familiar, that's because I cosponsored a bill earlier this year to abolish this harmful rule. That bill, which passed with bipartisan support in both the House and Senate, was just recently vetoed by President Biden. This fight is not over, however, and I am thankful that there are others in our government willing to join me in fighting against harmful and overbearing bureaucrats, and I pledge to vote in favor of overriding Biden's veto very soon.

Next Stop: New York City

Despite their claims to the contrary, the actions of certain New York City officials have resulted in substantial increases in the frequency and severity of major crimes in our nation's largest city. Instances of rape, assault, robbery, and grand larceny have become more commonplace, yet decisions by local district attorneys have meant that hundreds to thousands of criminals have been released back onto the streets only hours after arrest, and have received unreasonably and dangerously light sentences, or no punishment at all. Police officers have been betrayed by prosecutors who refuse to bring charges against criminals, and victims have been robbed of the compensation and justice they deserve.

The repeated failures by the Manhattan District Attorney's office to uphold the rule of law, to pursue justice, and its ongoing neglect of victims cannot continue. Our concern is even more warranted by the fact that New York City receives federal funds for the purpose of keeping its streets safe and citizens protected.

On Monday, I am traveling to Manhattan with my Judiciary Committee colleagues to shine a light on the suffering of the real victims of these failed "defund the police" policies, and to ensure that federal funds are being used to better American's lives, not put them in greater danger. We will examine how the pro-crime, anti-victim policies under Manhattan District Attorney Alvin Bragg have led to increased violent crime rates across the city, needlessly endangering the lives and safety of millions of New York City residents. I would not be surprised if this becomes the first of many future hearings to address the rising crime rates and prosecutorial neglect in other large cities across the United States.

I hope this will be only the first step in holding elected officials accountable and in bringing justice to those who have suffered under New York's failed policies, while also helping to restore order to a city that was once a beacon of hope and peace to the world.

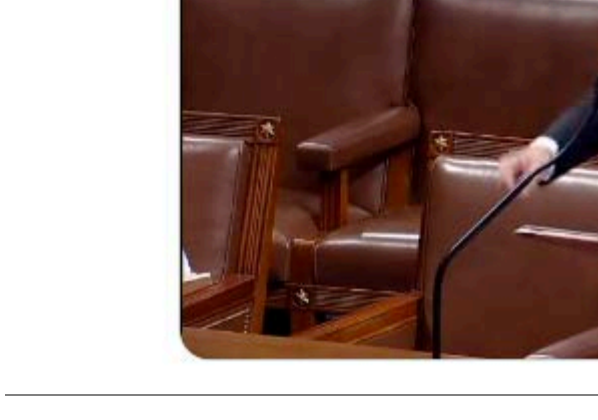

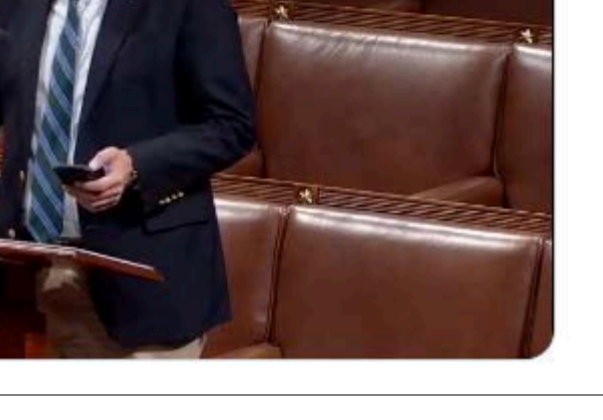

Cosponsored Legislation

Here are some highlights of [bills I'm cosponsoring](#):

- H.R. 1018**, the **Protect Farmers from the SEC Act**.
- H.R. 899**, which would abolish the Department of Education and return the responsibility of educating our children where it belongs: state and local governments.
- H.R. 812**, which would repeal the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 and rescind any unobligated funds within the bill.
- H.R. 781**, the **Guaranteeing Independent Growth (GIG) Act**. This will clarify the status of independent contractors within the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938.
- H.R. 779**, which ensures Social Security funds are only disbursed to those who have earned them, hardworking Americans and not illegal aliens.
- H.R. 764**, the **Trust the Science Act**, which will remove the gray wolf from the list of Endangered and threatened wildlife in the Endangered Species Act.
