WYOMING'S CONGRESSWOMAN

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Hello Laura,

The House of Representatives took bold steps to secure America's elections this past week, while I also advanced separate legislation to protect the traveling public and our livestock grazers on federal lands.

Keep reading to see how we're taking action to make our elections fair, protect public safety, secure energy, and support hardworking ranchers across Wyoming and the rest of the country.

Strengthening Election Integrity

I am pleased to report that the House passed the SAVE America Act to strengthen election integrity, which is sorely needed after the Biden-Harris border invasion. I am proud to cosponsor this legislation to give the American people confidence that our elections are fair, lawful, and reserved for U.S. citizens.

This bill requires a valid photo ID to vote in federal elections, enforces proof of U.S. citizenship when registering to vote, and directs states to clean up voter rolls by removing non-citizens. These are common-sense protections that safeguard our most sacred right and bring accountability back to the election process.

Shutting Down Chameleon Carriers

I introduced the Safety and Accountability in Freight Enforcement (SAFE) Act to combat chameleon carriers—trucking companies that shut down and reappear under a new name and DOT number to escape safety violations, regulatory penalties, and public accountability, putting everyone on the road at risk.

We saw the deadly consequences of this problem last week in Indiana, when an illegal alien truck driver crashed head-on into a van at a high rate of speed and killed four people. The particular truck involved is part of a larger network of carriers operating under multiple identities, sharing 139 trucks across different DOT numbers, racking up 91 crashes, and reporting miles even after authorities revoked their operating permits. These companies, in other words, are operating well outside of the law, seeking to evade detection, using illegal truck drivers who are not properly trained, and wreaking havoc on our roadways.

Chameleon carriers are not only illegal but difficult to detect and prosecute. By definition and purpose, they are intentionally seeking to avoid checkpoints, weigh stations, and oversight. My bill gives our federal agencies the tools that they need to more effectively identify these companies by integrating advanced technologies into existing Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration registration systems to help identify and punish these dangerous operators.

Fighting Against Climate Superfund Laws

I questioned Attorney General Pam Bondi about the Department of Justice's efforts to stop state and local government efforts to destroy American energy producers (while they themselves continue to use fossil fuels of course). States like Vermont and New York are pushing so-called "climate superfund" laws to impose massive, retroactive liability on energy producers for engaging in lawfully permitted past activity. These climate hysteria policies unfairly target energy-producing states like Wyoming, drive up costs on consumers, and are designed to fill the coffers of overstretched blue state budgets.

As winter weather continues to test our power grid, oil, gas, and coal remain essential to keeping homes heated, lights on, and costs down. Congressional Republicans and the Trump administration will continue working together to stop policies that drive up energy prices and threaten America's energy security.

Fairness for National Grassland Ranchers

The Natural Resources Committee advanced my Grasslands Grazing Act to the full House. This bill gives ranchers on National Grasslands the same certainty and protection that ranchers enjoy on other federal lands.


The Federal Land Policy and Management Act (FLPMA) established the federal grazing program with 10 year permits, first right of renewal, and other securities. As drafted, it applies to just BLM and select USFS lands, excluding grazers on grasslands, such as the Thunder Basin. I am proud to lead this effort alongside Senators Barrasso and Lummis to restore consistency to federal grazing policy and provide hardworking ranchers the stability they need to plan for the future while continuing to feed our communities.

Rescinding the 2009 Endangerment Finding

EPA's decision to rescind the Obama administration's 2009 Endangerment Finding is a necessary move to rein in years of regulatory overreach that cost the American people and businesses trillions while driving up energy costs.

I have long advocated to do away with this unlawful, unscientific, and harmful bureaucratic finding because of the strain it places on states like Wyoming and the unconstitutional nature in which it was adopted. Last year, through the One Big Beautiful Bill, I spearheaded an effort to defund so-called Inflation Reduction Act accounts, which spent billions on so-called greenhouse gas reductions, all of which were based on the flawed endangerment finding. This week's announcement from the EPA is the final nail in the coffin to focus federal policy on serving the American people and away from decades of climate hysteria.




