Fighting the EPA's Newest Assault on Wyoming Coal

Earlier this week, the Environmental Protection Agency announced its intent to implement a new Interstate Transport Rule, which will place highly restrictive policies on Wyoming energy and coal production. To do this, they are choosing to ignore their obligations under the Clean Air Act, a law which requires them to recognize Wyoming's implementation plan to reduce smog.

Not only is this a blatant refusal by the EPA to follow a major bipartisan law passed by Congress, it also is yet another direct attack on American energy production by the Biden Administration. Instead of strengthening our nation's energy independence, this administration's rules will result in further damage to electricity reliability, balloon already-high energy costs for consumers, and eliminate coal jobs in Wyoming.

Rest assured that I will not let this "Green New Deal"-style activism go unchallenged.

Man Killed in Action Honored
SHERIDAN—Sheridan's first Me- morial services for one of her sons who died in action in World War II were held fhis week at the Im- manuel Lutheran church. The ser- vices were in honor of Herman Schmidt, 28. gunner's mate third class, U. S. navy, who was lost in action at Pearl Harbor, Dec. 7, while he was on duty on a U. S. warship. The body was not recov- ered.

Honoring WWII Gunner's Mate 3rd **Class Herman Schmidt**

Next week, Gunner's Mate 3rd Class Herman Schmidt of Sheridan, WY will be laid to rest at Arlington National Cemetery with full military honors. Petty Officer Schmidt was killed during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor while serving on the USS Oklahoma, becoming one of our nation's first casualties in World War II.

Though his remains were recovered during the course of World War II, he and many others were unable to be positively identified until recently. Thanks to the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency's (DPAA) USS Oklahoma Project and advances in DNA processing, all personnel from the battleship have been accounted for, with 92% of the Sailors and Marines individually identified.

I am thankful for the efforts of the DPAA and others to identify our fallen unidentified service members and provide their families the closure they've long desired. We must never take for granted the sacrifice of those who paid the ultimate price for our freedom and all men and women who have dedicated their lives to protect our nation.
