WYOMING'S CONGRESSWOMAN

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Hello Laura,

The House of Representatives was out of session last week, but I look forward to returning to Washington, D.C. and continuing to do the work you elected me to do, including fulfilling President Trump's legislative agenda. While D.C. was largely quiet, I have continued to work on behalf of Wyoming and introduced legislation to protect our mail delivery. I also have some unfortunate news to announce regarding the onerous Corporate Transparency Act. Keep reading to learn about these issues and more.

Continuing to Fight for Wyoming's Postal Facilities

Last week, I introduced two key pieces of legislation to address rural mail concerns in Wyoming: the [POSTAL Act](#) and the [INFORM Act](#). I am also pleased to report that I have introduced my third postal bill this Congress, the [Postal Processing Protection Act](#). The bill, which I am leading with Rep. Emanuel Cleaver (D-MO) and Senators Mike Rounds (R-SD) and Dick Durbin (D-IL), would require the United States Postal Service (USPS), when considering the closure or consolidation of a facility, to apply the same set of rigorous standards and procedures that currently exist for storefront post offices to our sorting, distribution, and processing facilities. This would force the USPS to effectively measure the impact its proposed changes could have on rural mail service and ensure timely notice and opportunity for feedback from those most affected.

I am sure that many of you saw that Postmaster General Louis DeJoy announced his plans to resign last week. While this is a step in the right direction to improve rural mail delivery, DeJoy's disastrous "Delivering for America" plan remains intact. It is my hope that the USPS starts prioritizing timely mail, particularly for rural communities, either on its own or through supporting my legislation. We will continue to push back against efforts to disenfranchise our rural states in terms of timely mail delivery.

The USPS revealed on Friday that it will maintain certain mail processing operations in Casper and Cheyenne—a positive move for our state. Alongside planned upgrades to our postal facilities, this step forward boosts hope for dependable service. Yet, hurdles remain. I'm dedicated to moving my legislative efforts through Congress to solidify these improvements and halt future out-of-state mail rerouting, ensuring a robust postal future for Wyoming.

Important Update on the Corporate Transparency Act

As many of you know, I have firmly opposed the burdensome Corporate Transparency Act (CTA) for quite some time now, through my support of multiple pieces of legislation—including the [Repealing Big Brother Overreach Act](#)—as well as being a co-author of a [letter](#) requesting the Treasury Department to delay implementation of the law and publishing an [op-ed](#) opposing the CTA in its entirety.

Late last year, the Fifth U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals revived the enforcement of the CTA's small business reporting requirements. Shortly thereafter, however, a larger panel of the Fifth Circuit reversed its own decision, meaning that the federal government was once again temporarily prohibited from enforcing the CTA's reporting requirements pending a final decision. Last week, the Fifth Circuit shifted course yet again and lifted the nationwide injunction it had previously issued against the enforcement of the law. As a result, affected small businesses must once again report their beneficial ownership information (BOI) by the new deadline of **March 21, 2025**.

We will continue to pursue our legislation and will be seeking assistance from the White House as to next steps.

Working to Strengthen Parental Rights in Education

I introduced [H.R.1416](#), the Parental Oversight and Educational Transparency Act, which would bolster parental rights in education and ensure that parents are the main decision-makers regarding their children's education. Current law requires schools to notify parents *annually* about activities involving the collection, disclosure, or use of personal student information, as well as surveys containing sensitive questions or non-emergency, invasive physical examinations. Despite the current law being clear as to what is required, however, schools have continued to violate these mandates. In a recent case, the Department of Education found that the Cedar Grove School District in New Jersey failed to provide proper notice or the opportunity for parents to opt their children out of "equity" and "diversity" surveys.

My bill addresses these ongoing issues by requiring schools to not only provide annual notification at the beginning of the school year, but to also directly notify parents and obtain written consent at least two weeks before any such activities take place. This ensures parents receive clear, actionable information and have a meaningful opportunity to protect their children's privacy and moral upbringing.

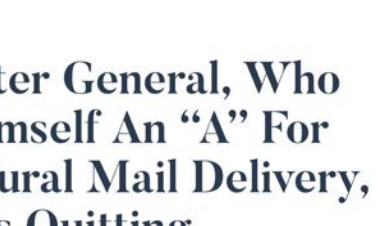
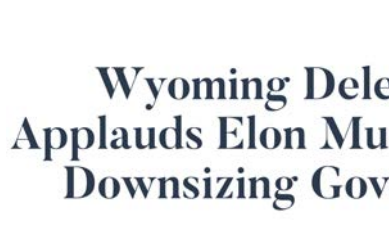
