I had a busy but exciting week in Washington, D.C., as my time was filled with committee hearings, constituent meetings, floor votes, and more.

From ending the partial government shutdown to advancing legislation that strengthens domestic mineral production, my focus remains on putting Wyoming's interests first.

In this week's newsletter, I will discuss the ways in which House Republicans are fighting to ensure our law enforcement agencies and officers have the tools and resources they need, that our supply chains are strengthened to prevent foreign adversarial meddling, that the freedoms guaranteed by the First Amendment are never compromised, and that we keep men and boys out of the spaces and activities reserved for women and girls.


Funding Our Government

House Republicans voted last week to end the Democrats' days-long government shutdown, including delivering certainty for the American people. With this vote, we have now had signed into law 11 of the 12 appropriations bills, covering 96% of federal government funding. The final bill remaining is to fund the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), on which we previously had a negotiated solution before Democrats decided to side with criminal illegal aliens.

The last appropriations bill remaining for approval by the House and Senate funds Border Patrol, ICE, TSA, the Coast Guard, the Secret Service, and FEMA. We had fortunately already included in our July, 2025 "One Big Beautiful Bill" adequate appropriations to keep President Trump's border security agenda alive and on track—despite Democrat delays, so those enforcement activities will continue apace. Their current opposition, however, is threatening, among other things, FEMA emergency response actions, TSA, and funding for the men and women of the Coast Guard.

We did pass a 2-week continuing resolution for DHS, with Democrats now demanding 10 "reforms" that would essentially gut our ability to enforce immigration law and remove dangerous criminal illegal aliens from our shores, while so constraining our law enforcement officers and judicial system that deportation would become largely nonexistent. We will not cave, and I will always vote to protect the brave men and women who keep our nation secure.

Standing Up for Free Speech




In Judiciary, we held an oversight hearing on Europe's Threat to American Speech with Graham Linehan, an Irish comedian targeted by the United Kingdom under hate speech laws for his advocacy in favor of women and girls against so-called transgenderism.

We discussed Britain's "non-crime hate incidents," a social credit score system where the government flags speech that challenges its preferred political narrative to get its citizens fired, debanked, and shunned from society. Linehan himself was detained by armed police over Tweets that he sent while in America.

In the so-called liberal democracies of Europe, citizens are being arrested and convicted for their social media posts. In 2023 alone, British police made over 12,000 arrests for offensive posts, more than 30 per day.

As we saw the Biden administration and woke left try to import this model into our nation during Covid, in relation to the integrity of the 2020 election, and J6, it is more important than ever to defend our First Amendment rights, through efforts such as my First Amendment Accountability Act.

Keeping Men Out of Women's Sports



During a Judiciary markup, I spoke in support of the Protection of Women in Olympic and Amateur Sports Act, because women and girls deserve to compete on a level playing field.

Men have no place in women's sports. This bill does one thing and does it well. It keeps men out of women's competitions. It does not stop men from competing in men's sports, and it does not attack anyone's identity.

The left keeps trying to rewrite and redefine reality, inventing terms like "cisgender" and creating confusion to push their radical agenda, but we will not let them erase women's opportunities.

We've already seen the consequences when men compete in women's events. Female athletes face unfair competition and even physical harm. This legislation protects women in every sport and preserves the rights women have long fought for.

Securing America's Critical Minerals

The House passed the Critical Mineral Dominance Act, strengthening America's ability to produce critical minerals here at home and reducing our dependence on foreign adversaries.

The bill codifies three Trump Executive Orders to streamline permitting, expedite priority mining projects on federal lands, and cut unnecessary regulatory barriers.

China currently controls nearly 90% of global critical mineral processing. We cannot allow the Chinese Communist Party to hold our supply chains, industries, and national security hostage.

Wyoming's abundant critical mineral resources position our state to lead and end our reliance on foreign adversaries for the elements fundamental to our national security and modern economy.


Upcoming Congress in Your Communities


