Awareness of the Natural Asset Company Threat is Growing!

For the past few weeks, much of my time has been spent standing up against the harmful Securities and Exchange Commission's (SEC) proposal to permit the listing of "Natural Asset Companies" (NACs) on the New York Stock Exchange. This includes my attempt to defund this proposed change through the appropriations process, raising the issue in the news, speaking and providing information to other members of Congress, and petitioning the SEC to extend the public comment period (which was granted).

As the proposal outlines, NACs are a "new concept pioneered" by the Intrinsic Exchange Group Inc. (IEG), a private company founded and funded by entities with ties to left wing political groups and environmentalists.

The purpose of NACs is to establish a non-traditional investing mechanism that would allow for the buying and selling of rights to the "natural assets" of both private and public lands. NACs, however, have a dubious legal foundation, would inflict great harm on the U.S. economy, violate both public and private property rights, are contrary to public policy, undermine our national security, and are part of a larger effort and agenda focusing on engineered scarcity.

We must stop these efforts to securitize the "natural assets" of our most important property, water and energy resources, and we need your help. Every day, more people are joining the opposition movement against NACs, which threaten to dismantle U.S. economic prosperity and give China and Russia control over our natural resources. Just this week, 25 state attorneys general – including Wyoming's AG – sent an in-depth letter to the SEC exposing the many dangers this rule change poses to our nation. I'm thankful that these strong legal voices, as well as R-CALF USA, the Uinta County Citizens Coalition, the American Stewards of Liberty, and so many others are speaking out against this rule.

Ending President Biden's Reverse-Robin Hood Tactics

Unlike the famed Robin Hood, the quintessential man of the people, the Biden Administration has chosen a different approach: taking federal settlement payments away from victimized parties and handing them over to liberal activist groups not subject to Congressional oversight.

American Dollars Belong in America, Not China

Last year I exposed the monumental failure and exorbitant waste of taxpayer dollars by the Biden Administration's EV infrastructure programs. To date, millions of dollars have been spent to build EV chargers across the country; the only problem is, no chargers have been built.

Instead of abandoning this waste of time and money, President Biden is making a massive last-ditch effort to keep the EV industry – which already can't exist without federal tax credits and subsidies – afloat by abandoning Buy America requirements. This makes absolutely no sense! Biden is choosing to not only waste taxpayer dollars on a program that is a proven disaster, but now those dollars will be sent to China instead of U.S. manufacturers. Final Call for Rock Springs RMP Comments

The public comment period for the Rock Springs Resource Management Plan closes this Wednesday, January 17. As a refresher, the Bureau of Land Management's preferred plan will block grazing, energy exploration and production, mining, recreation, and most other economic activities on nearly 2 million acres of land in the southwestern quadrant of our state. It is impossible to describe the scope and breadth of harm this will cause to our communities, our economy, our ability to provide affordable and reliable energy, and our legacy industries; but there is not only hope on the horizon, but a way to stop this nonsense.

Recently, many of you have reached out to my staff to voice your concerns about the US Postal Service's plans to close the processing centers in Cheyenne and Casper. I want you to know that not only are we tracking this concerning announcement, but we are working diligently to obtain additional information from USPS so that we can find a way to keep these facilities open here in the Cowboy State. I'm also aware of the significant delays and problems with package and home mail delivery that many of you are experiencing, as well as mailing address issues in Colony, WY.

Just this week, several of my staffers held a call with USPS officials, and frankly we were irate at the lack of clarity and understanding shown. As a lifelong Wyomingite, I know how important reliable mail service is to our state, and I will do everything in my power to ensure that the US Postal Service listens to your concerns and provides us with the same standard of service available across our nation.





Cosponsored Legislation



Here are some highlights of [bills I'm cosponsoring](#):

- [H.J.Res. 69](#), which nullifies the EPA's rule implementing "Good Neighbor" standards on the Clean Air Act.
- [H.J.Res. 98](#), which nullifies the National Labor Relations Boards Standard for Determining Joint Employer Status rule that creates new requirements on joint employer standards.
- [H.R. 4705](#), the *Stopping Teachers Unions from Damaging Education Needs Today (STUDENT) Act*.
- [H.R. 5336](#), the *Grant Transparency Act*, which requires federal agencies to publish the rating systems, scoring method, and other evaluative measures used by the agency in considering and selecting grant recipients.
- [H.R. 5530](#), the *VA Emergency Transportation Act*, which limits the Secretary of Veterans Affairs ability to change the rate of reimbursement for veterans that use emergency medical transportation services.
- [H.R. 5863](#), the *Federal Disaster Tax Relief Act*, which prevents recipients of disaster relief funding from certain qualified disasters from being penalized with additional taxes on compensatory funds received.

Massie Introduces Bill to Lower the Age to Buy A Handgun from an FFL to 18

Massie's bill, the *Lower Handgun Purchase Age Act*, would amend the Gun Control Act of 1968 to lower the minimum age for purchasing a handgun from 21 to 18. The bill is cosponsored by Reps. Chip Roy (R-TX), Mark Green (R-TN), and Mike Johnson (R-LA).

Under current law, individuals must be at least 21 years old to purchase a handgun from a licensed firearms dealer. Massie's bill would change this requirement to 18, making it easier for young adults to defend themselves and their families.

Massie's bill has been introduced in the House and is currently pending in the House Committee on Energy and Commerce. It has not yet been voted on by the full House.

Massie's bill is part of a broader effort to expand gun rights and reduce gun violence. It follows the lead of other bills introduced by Reps. Roy, Green, and Johnson, which would also lower the age limit for purchasing a handgun from 21 to 18.

Massie's bill is supported by the National Rifle Association (NRA) and other pro-gun organizations. It is opposed by the Brady Campaign to Prevent Gun Violence and other anti-gun organizations.

Massie's bill is expected to face significant opposition in the Senate, where Republicans are unlikely to support it. However, it could become law if it passes the House and is signed by President Biden.
