We discussed numerous ambiguities within the Endangered Species Act and Marine Mammal Protection Act which have allowed the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and other agencies to ignore the original intent of these laws and to substantially expand agency power over land and water use. One needs to look no further than the fully recovered grizzly bear population in Wyoming for a clear example of these failures. The grizzly population has exceeded recovery goals for over two decades, yet the USFWS refuses to delist it, thereby saddling Wyoming with an overabundance of this apex predator. It is imperative that we protect the endangered and threatened species that truly need such protections while also safeguarding our landowners, energy producers, water managers, and other industries.

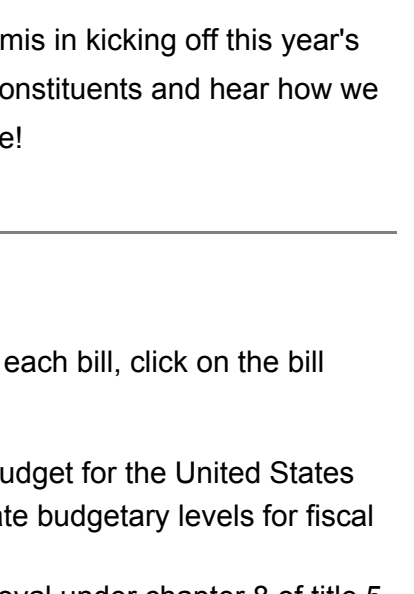
