



Hello Laura,

It's been another busy and productive week in Washington, introducing new legislation, winning for water in the west, and demanding transparency over the costs of illegal immigration.

Here is a look at what's been happening.

## A \$100 Million Win for Water in Goshen County

The collapse of the Fort Laramie irrigation tunnel in 2019 has had catastrophic effects on delivering water to one of Wyoming's most productive farming regions. The reconstruction and maintenance of this critical infrastructure has been a top priority for me as your member of Congress. I am therefore pleased to report that, just last week, the Department of the Interior approved \$100 million from the *One Big Beautiful Bill* for this aging system, supporting communities in both Wyoming and Nebraska. This money is in addition to the \$14.6 million in community funding that I already secured with Rep. Adrian Smith from western Nebraska.

Our western way of life would not be possible if our predecessors had not worked proactively to build the water infrastructure and canal systems that literally opened the continent for American settlement. That's why as chair of the House Subcommittee on Water, Wildlife and Fisheries, I helped establish the billion-dollar fund for water infrastructure projects in the *One Big Beautiful Bill*. The additional funding is designed to move beyond "band-aid fixes," while returning Wyoming tax dollars to our communities to develop and maintain this critical infrastructure for current and future generations.

## Fighting for a Balanced Budget

I voted this week in support of a constitutional balanced budget amendment providing a long-term roadmap for putting our financial house in order.

The amendment would cap federal spending based on average revenues collected over the prior three years, with any spending above that limit requiring a two-thirds vote in both chambers. Though the effort fell short of passing the House, the fight for fiscal discipline is far from over.







When Wyoming shows up, Washington listens.


Senators Barrasso, Lummis, and I had another successful Wyoming Wednesday meeting with constituents to discuss their priorities and answer questions.




I held a virtual town hall with Chairman Jim Jordan, where we discussed codifying Trump's successes, restoring real conversation, protecting American liberties, and so much more.
