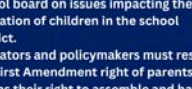

## Fighting for Parents Rights



### FACT SHEET

#### Parents Bill of Rights Act

Parents have a God-given right to make decisions for their children. Unfortunately, many school districts have been ignoring the wishes of parents while special interest groups try to criminalize free speech. This list of rights will make clear to parents what their rights are and clear to schools what their duties to parents are.

| <b>1) Parents have the right to know what their children are being taught:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>School districts must post curriculum information publicly.</li><li>States must provide the public a copy of any revisions to the state's academic standards or learning benchmarks.</li><li>Parents must be given timely notice of any school's plan to eliminate gifted and talented programs.</li><li>Schools must provide parents with a list of books and reading materials available in the school library.</li></ul>         | <b>3) Parents have the right to see the school budget and spending:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>There must be public disclosure of school district budgets and each school's budget, including revenues and expenditures.</li></ul>  |
| <b>2) Parents have the right to be heard:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Teachers must offer two in-person meetings with parents each year.</li><li>Parents must be allowed to address the school board on issues impacting the education of children in the school district.</li><li>Educators and policymakers must respect the First Amendment right of parents as well as their right to assemble and have a say in their child's education.</li><li>School districts should consider community feedback when making decisions.</li></ul> | <b>4) Parents have the right to protect their child's privacy:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Schools must not share student data with tech companies without parental permission.</li><li>Schools must not sell student data for commercial purposes.</li><li>Parents have a say when schools develop or update their student privacy policies and procedures.</li><li>Parents must consent before any medical exam takes place at school, including mental health or substance use disorder screenings, and before students are surveyed.</li></ul> |
|  | <b>5) Parents have the right to keep their children safe:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Schools must notify parents of violent activity occurring on school grounds or at school-sponsored events while still protecting the privacy of the students involved in the incident.</li></ul>   |

## Moving My Legislation Forward

Wyoming was at the House Natural Resources Committee this week, as three of my recent bills were discussed in subcommittee hearings.

On Thursday, the Water, Wildlife, and Fisheries subcommittee empaneled witnesses to discuss the delisting of grizzly bears in Montana and Wyoming. Grizzlies in Wyoming have surpassed over 1000 bears in recent years, more than doubling the recovery goal stated in the Endangered Species Act.

The Indian and Insular Affairs subcommittee, which I chair, met Friday with representatives from the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Seminole Tribe of Florida, and United Auburn Rancheria for a hearing on my bills that will amend existing laws to allow federally recognized tribes to enter 99-year leases for land held in trust and allow tribes to lease, sell, or transfer real property under fee title as they see fit.

Both of these current laws are regularly amended, creating a piecemeal approach to governing and provides no certainty for Tribes to plan their futures. Tribal governments already seek to make the best decisions for their members' social, cultural, and economic security. These bills will help ensure that Indian lands, whether owned in fee, owned in restricted fee, or held in trust for the benefit of tribes, are able to be used as tribes see fit.

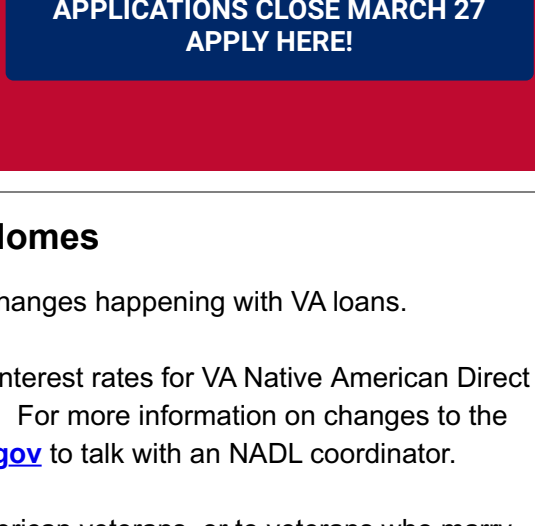
Each of these bills will next go through a "mark-up" session, in which I and other members of the Natural Resources Committee debate the bills in-depth and vote on various proposed amendments before they finally advance to a full vote by the House of Representatives. 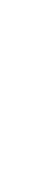
## Helping Native American Veterans Buy Homes

Native American military veterans, there are some big changes happening with VA loans.

This week, the Department of Veterans Affairs lowered interest rates for VA Native American Direct Loans (NADL) from 6% to 2.5% for homes on trust land. For more information on changes to the NADL program, call **888-349-7541** or email [NADL@va.gov](mailto:NADL@va.gov) to talk with an NADL coordinator.

Please note that this loan is only available to Native American veterans, or to veterans who marry Native American non-veterans. Veterans who do not qualify for this program may still be eligible for housing assistance through standard VA-backed loans, which [can be found here](#).

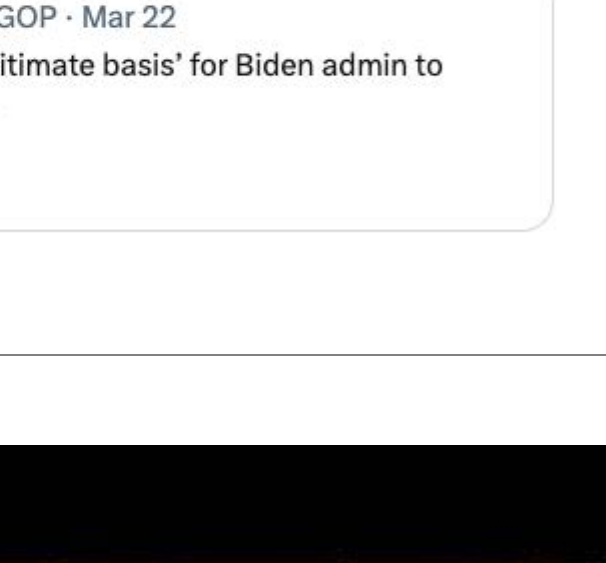
## Team Hageman Hits the Road

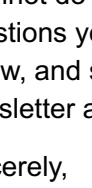
- Voted **YES** on **H.R. 5**, The Parents Bill of Rights Act
- Voted **YES** on **H.R. 1093**, directing the Department of State to compile a report on the implementation of advanced capabilities in the security partnership between the U.S., United Kingdom, and Australia
- Voted **YES** on **H.R. 1159**, which provides periodic reviews and reports on the Department of State's guidance to federal agencies on the U.S.-Taiwan relationship
- Voted **NO** on **H.R. 406**, which would grant immunities and privileges to international appointees to the Association of Southeast Asian Nations, including Myanmar, which is currently ruled by a military junta which overthrew a democratically elected government
- Voted **YES** to override President Biden's veto of **H.J. Res. 30**, which would have nullified a Department of Labor rule promoting Environmental, Social, and Governance investment funds
- Voted **YES** on **H. Con. Res. 25**, allowing the use of the U.S. Capitol's Emancipation Hall for a ceremony remembering victims of the Holocaust

## Cosponsored Legislation

Here are some highlights of [bills I'm cosponsoring](#):

- H.R. 5**, the Parents Bill of Rights Act
- H.J. Res. 44**, which will reject the ATF's latest anti-Second Amendment rule banning firearms by changing the definition of a "stabilizing brace", transforming hundreds of thousands of law-abiding citizens into potential criminals overnight and without due-process
- H. Res. 236**, which prevents the government from funding a massive new FBI headquarters outside of Washington, D.C., giving tacit approval to their nefarious behavior and suppression of conservative Americans
- H.R. 1768**, which restructures the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases into 3 separate national research institutes led by Senate confirmed directors

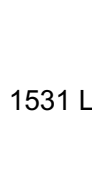

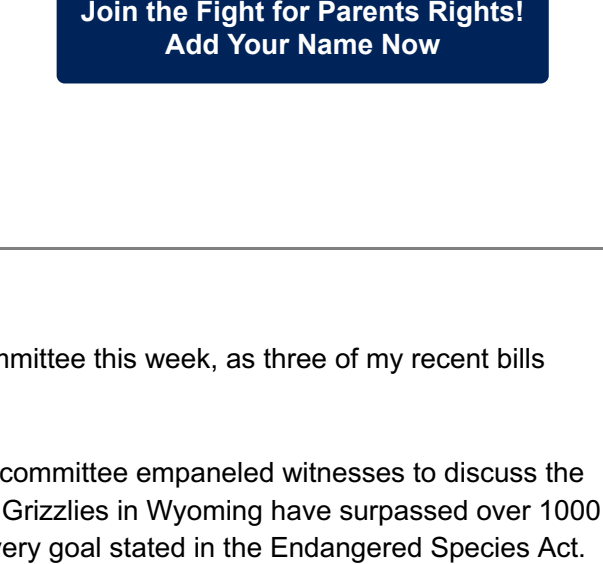

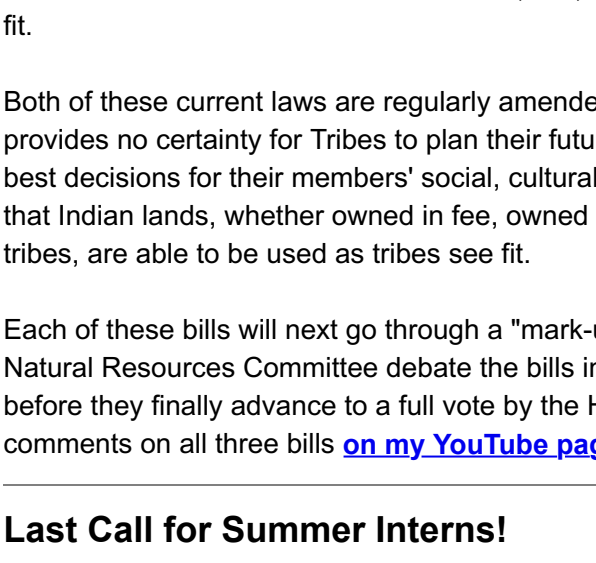

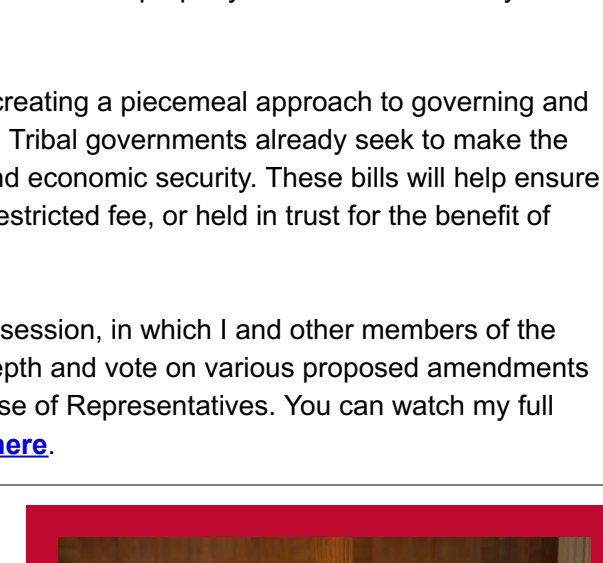


Firefighters look on as a wildfire burns near Yellowstone in Wyoming. (Scott Greenberg/National Park Service via AP file)
