# The Reality of "Bidenomics", Part 2

Back on October 1st, I shared with you how "Bidenomics" is hurting our pocketbooks and erasing our life savings. I mentioned the direct impacts Biden's failed policies are having on our ability to put food on the table and provide for our energy needs. Although America has the resources available to provide affordable, clean, and reliable energy (much of which is right here in Wyoming), President Biden and his band of bureaucrats refuse to allow us to access them, adopting more and more regulations and restrictions, thereby preventing us from lessening the economic burden on the everyday taxpayer.

Just this week, the New York Times exposed the Biden Administration's efforts to fudge the numbers by falsely claiming that they are actually saving taxpayer money. The NYT article also discusses the damage that this Administration has done by implementing bad fiscal decisions and wasteful spending. Biden officials have sought to employ an "accounting mirage" to claim a \$300 billion "savings" that they had allocated to implement their student loan forgiveness program money Congress never appropriated, related to a program Congress never approved, and a giveaway that the Supreme Court has declared to be illegal. The Administration, in other words, is claiming a "savings" of \$300 billion related to money they were never entitled to appropriate in the first place. If only we could all use that time-worn trick of "saving" money we never had in the first place!

This NYT article describes how interest on the national debt is now a record \$659 billion per year – and growing. Within 30 years, the interest on our debt alone will be our nation's largest annual expenditure. We simply cannot ignore this reality any longer: we must get our nation's spending under control. For Democrats, the solution is to continue to raise taxes. My Republican colleagues and I have a different approach: we must look at our nation's spending habits, cut out the waste, cut federal agencies and programs, stop the nonsense surrounding such things as "diversity" offices, force our military to focus on national defense rather than the newest woke agenda, and dramatically shrink the size and scope of the federal government. That is why House Republicans are committed to passing individual appropriations bills; offsetting necessary expenditures through cuts to the enormous waste, fraud, and abuse that has exploded in the federal government; and defunding programs that shouldn't exist.

It's not often that I recommend a NY Times article, but if you focus on the actual numbers and statistics they provide, while ignoring their attempted spin, the reality of our nation's spending problem is becoming unavoidable, even for committed leftists.



### Congratulations, Speaker Johnson!





# My Newest Bill will Protect Wyoming's Industries



Ever since the Bureau of Land Management first announced their draft resource management plan for the Rock Springs Field Office, Wyomingites far and wide have loudly pointed out its countless flaws and the disastrous outcomes it promises for our state. Regardless of which alternative BLM selects, Wyoming will suffer, though Alternative B (unsurprisingly, the BLM's preferred option) promises the greatest damage to our economy.

In order to protect the industries like recreation, energy production, and livestock grazing that drive Wyoming's economy and form our resilient spirit, I introduced H.R. 6085 on Friday. This bill will permanently prevent the BLM from using this draft plan, forcing them to restart their evaluation process, hopefully listening this time to the needs of our communities. By legislatively preventing this rule from taking effect, our recreation, energy, ranching, and related industries will be able to continue to operate as they have been, removing confusion over potential changes and allowing for uninterrupted activities. # A Busy Week in the Natural Resources Committee



Following Speaker Johnson's unanimous election, the Natural Resources Committee convened to hold two important hearings related to Western resources.

In the first, <u>I spoke</u> in favor of Rep. Boebert's Restoring American Energy Dominance Act, pushing back against government-forced dependence on unreliable energy sources such as wind and solar. Tom Kropatsch, representing the Wyoming Oil and Gas Conservation Commission, testified about how vital the revenue generated by our oil and gas companies is to funding Wyoming services. Reliable energy is not only important for keeping our lights on and heating our homes, but it provides some of the highest paying jobs in the state, and all of us benefit. More oil, gas, and coal development will lower our utility and transportation costs, while also producing more revenue to be reinvested in our communities.

In my Water, Wildlife and Fisheries Subcommittee <u>I questioned</u> the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) witness about the agency's attempt to unilaterally adjust the process used to delist species from the Endangered Species Act. Not only are these unelected bureaucrats ignoring and distorting Congressional intent (requiring the USFWS to delisted once a species meets objective recovery criteria), but they are also attempting expand what is considered "critical habitat" as a workaround to restrict recreational access and economic development on our public lands. I was able to prod the USFWS employee into admitting that critical habitat has little conservation value. That is an important admission for future efforts to use the ESA to control large swaths of land.

The bottom line is that the Biden Administration officials have far exceeded Congressional authority, to the detriment of our country, and we are all paying the price – at the gas pump, at the grocery store, and everywhere else. This hearing was another example of the importance of the work my colleagues and I are doing on the ESA Working Group.

The full committee of Natural Resources met Thursday for a mark-up which included my bill, H.R. <u>3415</u>, the *Pilot Butte Power Plant Conveyance Act*. This bill transfers ownership of the Pilot Butte Power Plant from the Bureau of Reclamation to Midvale Irrigation District and was passed without opposition by the Natural Resources Committee! H.R. 3415 is now awaiting a full vote by the entire House of Representatives.

# Ensuring Taxpayer Dollars are Used Properly, Part 3

Less than 36 hours after Speaker Johnson was sworn in, House Republicans completed debate on and passed the Energy and Water Development appropriations bill. The Republican-led House has now passed 5 of the 12 appropriations bills, funding over 70% of our government. We are still awaiting the Democrat-led Senate to pass any. Next week, the House will begin consideration of three additional appropriations bills as we work toward fully funding the government for Fiscal Year 2024. I am pleased to report that two of my amendments were adopted as part of the Energy and Water Development bill:

- The Biden Administration continues to expand its war against reliable American-produced energy. The Department of Energy's "Industrial Decarbonization Roadmap" is the latest attempt to villainize those energy resources that have built this country, powered our economy, and created the most prosperous society in the history of mankind. My amendment, adopted by a voice vote, blocks all federal funds from going towards the implementation of this plan and all related projects.
- First they tried to take our gas stoves and now they are coming after our water heaters. The amount of control the Biden Administration seeks to exercise over even the most basic aspects (and appliances) of our lives knows no bounds. If implemented, proposed rules from the Department of Energy would create increasingly burdensome standards for consumer water heaters in the name of reducing "global emissions" and their effort to force us into what they call an "energy transition," but that we recognize is more accurately called "government imposed wretchedness." I don't believe the federal government belongs in your kitchen or utility closet; you deserve the freedom to choose what appliances and products you can afford and that meet your needs. Thankfully, many of my colleagues agree, and my amendment to block funds from going towards yet another instance of government overreach was adopted into the final bill which passed the House.
